Risk		Trisomy 21	
		The calculated risk for Trisomy 21 (with nuchal translucency) is above the cut off, which indicates an increased risk. After the result of the Trisomy 21 Test (with nuchal translucency), it is expected that among less than 50 pregnancies with the same data, there is one trisomy 21 pregnancy. The free beta HCG level is high. The PAPP-A level is low. The calculated risk by PRISCA depends on the accuracy of the information provided by the referring physician. Please note that risk calculations are statistical approaches and have no diagnostic value! The patient combined risk presumes the NT measurement was done according to accepted guidelines (Prenat Diagn 18: 511-523 (1998)). The laboratory can not be held responsible for their impact on the risk assessment ! Calculated risks have no diagnostic value!
